








### Membership of POMS Colleges (2009-2021)

- > 59 papers submitted (2019:37, 2018: 48)
- We had a two round process for the competition
- Conflicts of interest were first declared by the judges
- First round:
  - ▶ Each paper was reviewed by three referees with no conflict of interest with the paper
  - Chairs were not involved in the referee assignment of papers that they have conflict of interest with
- Second round:
  - Finalists were evaluated by paper competition committee based on both the submitted paper, and the presentation at this conference.

# Evaluation from the 1st round judges

- Evaluate the paper based on the following criteria using the rating from I-IO (10 being best and I being the weakest)
  - Relevance to the Supply Chain Management
  - Problem Modeling
  - Strength of Results
  - Useful of Managerial Insights
  - Clarity/Style of Writing
- Answer a question: Would you recommend this paper for the finalist round?
