#### **CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES**



#### 11:00 am - KEYNOTE PRESENTATION

Dr. Jose Romero, MD is Secretary of the Arkansas Department of Health (ADH). He is a member of the Governor's cabinet and provides senior scientific and executive leadership for the agency. Dr. Romero is currently the chairman of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP), which is providing guidance nationally on the prioritization and distribution of a COVID-19 vaccine. He is also a Professor of Pediatrics in the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS) and has board-certification in Pediatrics and Pediatric Infectious Diseases. He previously served as Chief Medical Officer at the ADH and was Director of the Section of Pediatric Infectious Diseases at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Arkansas Children's Hospital from 2008-2020.
