ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

The candidate must conduct high-quality research and publish in top-tier SCM journals; effectively teach SCM courses at the undergraduate or graduate level; serve as a research mentor to doctoral students; and interact effectively with colleagues to support and enhance our unique department culture.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Earned Ph.D. in supply chain management, operations management, business analytics, industrial engineering, or a closely related field by position start date; ABD candidates must successfully defend their dissertation by July 1, 2026.
- Evidence of being able to pursue an active research agenda and publish in top-tier SCM journals.
- Evidence of capability to effectively teach courses in supply chain management, operations management, business analytics, and related business areas.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Evidence of an active research agenda with publications in top-tier SCM journals.
- Evidence of teaching excellence in supply chain management courses at the graduate or undergraduate level.
- Strong training in applied empirical methods.
- Demonstrated knowledge of artificial intelligence through innovative teaching practices, cuttingedge research, or leadership in academic or professional communities.
- Research areas of interest in, but not limited to, procurement, supply chain resilience, sustainability, AI in SCM, and SCM technologies.
- Interest in collaboration with industry or public sector organizations.
- Evidence of successful external funding.

Application Deadline and Procedure:

The application deadline is **December 10, 2025**. Applications will continue to be accepted on a rolling basis for a reserve pool. Applications in the reserve pool may then be reviewed in the order in which they were received until the position is filled.
